This book chapter was published in W. Estabrooks' revision of his popular textbook, Auditory Verbal Therapy and Practice. The book serves the core text for the certification of AV therapists through the AG Bell Association and is commonly cited in the field. The chapter was based on an invited oral presentation that generated a substantial amount of interest and interaction among experts in the field of aural rehabilitation regarding the types of evidence required to best support AVT and the international collaborations that might be established to gather such evidence. This discussion is currently ongoing within the field. An associated article was published in The Volta Review.

Significant differences in discourse organization between the two groups of teachers led to serious misinterpretations and misjudgments of Inuit students' language and academic competence on the part of non-Inuit teachers.
